What is an ELPAC?

English Learner Parent Advisory Council

- Membership
 - Parents/guardians of current or former English learners
 - Voluntary
 - ELPAC officers
 - Members should include representatives of native languages most commonly spoken by students.

ELPAC Duties

- Advise school districts, school committees, and boards of trustees on matters related to English learners.
- Provide advice or recommendations on topics that parents/guardians believe are important to ELs.
 - Example: ELPACs may advise districts on requests submitted by parents/guardians to establish new language acquisition programs.

ELPAC Duties

- Meet regularly with school officials to participate in the planning and development of programs designed to improve educational opportunities for ELs.
- Participate in the review of school improvement plans and district improvement plans as the plans relate to ELs.
- Meet at least annually with the School Committee.
- Follow the Open Meeting Law.

What: The district is beginning a strategic planning process that will include various perspectives from the community.

Why: It is important to have an ELPAC representative on the Community Planning Team so that the voices and needs of English learners are represented.

826

There are 826 English learners in grades K-12 in the Public Schools of Brookline. (As of February 7, 2023)

12%

English learners make up 12% of the district's K-12 student enrollment. (As of February 7, 2023)

- Provide equitable and consistent opportunities for ELs to speak, read, write, and listen in English
 - EL teachers continue to collaborate and share strategies that encourage optimal opportunities for English learners to practice and develop their reading, writing, listening, and speaking skills in English
 - We continue to aim to have English learners scheduled for the appropriate amount of English instruction based on their level of English proficiency.
 - As a department, we reflect on our practices often to be sure they are equitable and consistent.
 - We offer school year (ex. Reading Scholars) and summer (ex. STAR Academy) programs to increase opportunities for students to develop their English language skills.

- Group ELs by ability and proficiency levels
 - English learner teachers must consider the following when developing a schedule for a student:
 - Overall level of English proficiency
 - Grade
 - Overall English learner caseload
 - Schedule limitations
 - Classroom space
 - Laws and regulations
 - Typically students are grouped as follows:
 - Foundational Level: Levels 1-3.4
 - Transitional Level: Levels 3.5-6
 - We continue to aim to have English learners scheduled for the appropriate amount of English instruction based on their level of English proficiency.

- Provide more social-emotional supports for families in their native language
 - Currently the district does not regularly provide social-emotional supports for families in a language other than English.
 - The district is able to provide families with local resources and organizations that have bilingual staff available to provide such support in some of our most common languages.
- Teach students about safe behaviors and how to protect themselves from racist attacks
 - As a district, we work hard to increase a sense of empathy, respect, and kindness for everyone throughout a variety of learning experiences (advisory, class lessons, community building activities, work with counselors).
 - We offer affinity spaces, communicate our values, and hold staff and students accountable for their actions.

- Provide clear communication and expectations regarding ELE class schedules
 - English learner teachers have been asked to communicate information directly with families about each student's ELE schedule.
 - Families are encouraged to contact their student's EL teacher if they have questions.
- Offer parents/guardians frequent opportunities to check-in regarding student engagement and progress
 - All English learner teachers have an open communication policy where families may contact them at any time to discuss their student's engagement and progress.
 - Progress reports are available twice a year for grades K-5 and eight times a year for grades 6-12 (4 IPR, 4 quarter grades).
 - Parent-teacher conferences are also available twice a year.

- Provide extra staff from the district to support ELPAC
 - We have brought back our Family and Community Engagement Coordinator position. This Coordinator, Betsy Davis, is now supporting ELPAC.
