





Total Non Personnel Budget


Non Personnel Budget By Major Category

Budge by Major Categories








• The Financial Assistance Program does NOT apply to optional activities, including but not limited to student travel programs and senior prom.

Goals


- Implement an objective financial assistance program and application process for all students and families.
