Building User Fees Refresher

- Need to review user fees due to significantly increased cost of building operations and maintenance
- Feb. 8 presentation (1st reading):
 - Converted from per-square-foot charge for Extended Days to hourly charge for everyone to increase clarity
 - Response from Extended Day directors was a preference for a per-student charge based on their program size
- Mar. 1 presentation (2nd reading):
 - Focus on Extended Day responses, preference for a per student charge
- Mar. 15 presentation (3rd reading)
 - Focus on revision of how ED wanted to count students, looked at some of the big questions on other user fees



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Proposal for ED building user fees for consideration and potential vote by committee Mar 29, 2023

- Proposal by ED Directors: \$110 per EEC capacity student
 - Reduce fees **further** by fraction of enrolled students who are on partial/full scholarships or vouchers
 - % of ED revenue would increase from 1.7% (FY23) to 2.12% before further reductions (exact scope of reductions TBD but based on FY23 data is not a significant proportion.)
- Request that policy take up with OSS/OTL/BEEP a policy/guideline on equitably providing after-school support for after-school programs that take in children with significant needs or preschoolers.
- Direct staff to work with Finance Chair to revise lease, including guarantees of space minimums/attributes, if possible before FY24 lease issued.

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BACE - Building User Fees

- Based on prior use, building user fees estimated at \$110-140K for FY24 (40% room use, 60% after-hours custodial fees)
 - ~½ of FY20 charge of \$240K (\$46K custodial, \$195K room use including \$60K for music lessons for PSB students.) Charges waived since then.
- Questions for consideration (repeated from March 15 meeting):
 - How should building user fees (custodial, security, equipment wear and tear) be considered for programs like BACE and Athletics which are part of PSB but occur after-hours?
 - If we don't charge those fees, where does the funding for after-hours custodial and security come from?
 - Do we differentiate between user fees for residents vs non-residents? Online vs in-person classes?
 (NEW: PSB students in music classes?)
 - Do we defer a decision of building user fees for another year for BACE, or to later in the spring?
- **Proposal for consideration by subcommittee**: per learner per course (or per learner per single-session) charge for in-person programming (other than music lessons) to be charged with registration fee.
 - Scalable with BACE growth by in-person enrollees, not by class (which may still be smaller average enrollments)
 - Straight passthrough based on amount collected: does not reduce BACE course income
 - Does not charge BACE for K-12 PSB Performing Arts activities
 - Start with \$5 resident/\$10 non-resident (per learner per course) facility fee for FY24 (on par with swimming pool admission fee).



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Other User Fees

- Enrichment programs:
 - DASEP Program Director has agreed that hourly rate is appropriate.
 - DASEP was the only enrichment program being charged but several others exist as official non-profits and will be charged going forward.
- Brookline Music School:
 - BMS Executive Director supports rates.
- Other:
 - Reconfirm continued 0% charge to Town departments, PTOs?
