

- Originally called **Armistice Day** to mark the end of World War 1 on November 11, 1918, Veterans Day is an annual observance used to honor and celebrate those who have served in the US Armed Forces.
- We especially salute and honor the parents, guardians, and caregivers of 34 PSB students who are also military veterans or currently in active service. We acknowledge the veterans/active duty members of our community at-large as well as all of those that have passed away.

- On Thursday, November 3, Brookline High School staff were made aware of a chemical irritant found inside the 115 Greenough Street building near a first-floor bathroom close to the cafeteria.
- All students and staff were evacuated outside at approximately 11:47 a.m. while school administrators contacted emergency response personnel to responded to the scene. The building was deemed safe by 3:00 p.m. and after-school programming resumed as normal.
- All PSB staff and families were made aware of this development through email by 1:23 p.m. On-site BHS staff were also notified as information came in real-time from emergency services.
- A few individuals were transported to the nearest hospital for further evaluation. Most staff and students did not experience any symptoms and many others experienced eye and throat irritation and were checked out on site by BHS nurses and EMTs. Members who sought medical attention were discharged and are reported to be doing well.
- BHS team is committed to continuous improvement and is engaging in after action reviews

BHS Evacuation Incident on November 3
