<p>STAR Academy</p> <p>Director: Mindy Paulo</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● <b>Students Served:</b> Students in ELE and/or METCO entering grades K-8 next fall</li><li>● <b>Location:</b> TBD</li><li>● <b>Dates:</b> TBD</li></ul> <p>STAR Academy is a summer program for Brookline’s English learners and METCO students only. STAR provides opportunities for students to increase their reading, writing, communication, and comprehension skills across curriculum areas: math, science, social studies, and English language arts. Students will focus on developing their skills through a study of content area vocabulary and concepts. Teachers will introduce and reinforce the instructional language used in classroom settings throughout the school year. This program is an opportunity for students entering grades K-8 this September to enhance their social and academic knowledge. <i>Admission to this program is facilitated through an application process.</i></p> <p>Participants in STAR Academy have the option to attend a fee-based recreational program in the afternoon run by Brookline Adult &amp; Community Education.</p>

<p><b>ESY K-8 Students</b></p> <p><b>Summer Coordinator:</b> TBD</p>	<p><b>Regulatory Requirement:</b> To ensure that children with disabilities receive a free and appropriate public education (FAPE), all IEP teams consider, as appropriate, whether a child needs extended school year (ESY) services. With the purpose of minimizing substantial regression and reduce recoupment time, services provided during the summer are designed to help each child maintain skills and not lose progress made towards IEP goals.</p>
<p><b>ESY High School through Age 22 Students</b></p> <p><b>Summer Coordinator:</b> TBD</p>	<p><b>Participation:</b> Services and programming are based on a Team decision that extended school year programming is required with increased focus on opportunities that promote inclusion; recreational activities, enrichment programs, and access to social emotional learning.</p>



The standard-level core academic courses offered are designed to allow students to make up or to review work that was not successfully completed or that proved difficult during the regular school year. This allows our most vulnerable students to recover credit and graduate from BHS on a similar timeline as their peers. Summer School also offers elective courses in areas like photography and digital drawing, allowing students to explore their interests and earn credit toward graduation. Enrichment courses are also offered for students to continue their educational journey through the summer.</p>

This past summer, students attended Public Schools of Brookline's Calculus Project in the morning, and a digital media class, offered in partnership with Brookline Interactive Group, in the afternoon.
