



Middle of the Year Assessment





Using the Data and Next Steps





- Triangulate data using mClass and other sources to identify students who may be at risk for poor reading outcomes
- Determine next steps for supporting Tier I instruction
 - Create small groups in the classroom
 - Provide more time for specific students to become proficient with certain skills
 - Identify additional materials for specific students
- Support students in Tier II instruction in the classroom
 - Determine specific skills where students need more support
 - Create groups
