Dear Mary Ellen,

I'm writing to request approval from the Brookline Public Schools School Committee for the installation of a Buddy Bench at Baker School. The Baker School PTO has generously agreed to fund this initiative. This project has the support of Baker School Principal, Dr. Mary Brown.

The Buddy Bench is a simple idea to eliminate loneliness and foster friendship on the school playground. A buddy Bench is a colorful, clearly marked bench designed for students who may have difficulty navigating the process of finding playmates, or finding the confidence to join in, at recess. The way it works is that if a student feels lonely or has no one to play with at recess, they can go sit on the buddy bench. All students are taught that if they see a student at the buddy bench, they must go over and invite them into their play. This will give students the opportunity to both reach out for help and help other students by offering to be a friend. The goal of the bench is to teach students to reach out to one another, to eliminate loneliness and to foster friendships on the playground. Buddy Benches have been added at schools across the country and met with great success.

In addition to approval from Dr. Brown, I have also met with Erin Gallentine from Brookline Parks and Recreation and identified a spot on the Baker School Playground for the Buddy Bench. I'm happy to meet with whomever necessary to point out the proposed location.

The Buddy Bench project was proposed to Baker School staff and received unanimously positive feedback. This is what Baker staff members have to say about a Buddy Bench:

Haillie Shinohara, Special Educator Grades 6-8: "My son's school has a buddy bench. Not only does it help students who need help with being asked to join in on play, it also helps all students be more mindful and caring as a community. It's important to teach students how to build a community up from early years. For my son, he usually was one of the kids who invited kids to play when he noticed them sitting on the bench at his school. As a kindergartener that year, the buddy bench was one of the memories he treasures and helped him see himself as a good friend and part of a community. Hope we get one at Baker!"

Kaitlin Doherty, Grade 1: "I have wanted to have a buddy bench for years! There are many students I see every time I am on duty walking around with "nothing to do" and "no one to play with". It is hard to track down peer role models who would include them in the chaos of recess. If we had a place students could look and see children who need a friend to include them, it would be easier to get these students involved in an activity right away. I am in full support of this idea!"

Sue Peligian, Enrichment Support Specialist: "The most and least we can do for a human being is to provide different ways and opportunities to feel part of community. The buddy bench may be just the right thing for certain students -- a way for them to feel they are included if there is a place for them to be. No one wants to feel left out. No one should feel left out."

Summer Cosgrove, Grade 6 ELA Teacher: "A buddy bench is a nice way for students who may struggle to verbalize their loneliness find someone to play with. It's also a great opportunity for students to be kind to others, which is one of our core values here at Baker."

Alyssa Rose, Spanish Teacher: "A buddy bench will give the students a chance to practice two of our core values at Baker School--Be kind and help others. We need to offer our students more ways to practice these two core values in order for them to embrace them as part of their own values when they leave Baker School. A buddy bench educates our students about the importance of these values while it also welcomes those who are new into the Baker community and lends a hand to those who may need some help from others."

Whitney Fairley, Grade 3 Teacher: "I think it is important to note that children want to help, but they don't always know how. If they knew a student needed something from them, they'd offer help. The Buddy Bench is a concrete way for children to offer and accept help from each other. With a Buddy Bench, teachers can then practice language with students."

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
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
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
