



Bakalar Recital Hall Expansion Proposal

- Brookline Music School, Brookline's oldest and largest cultural organization, seeks permission to expand and renovate its recital hall.
- Currently, the school's recital hall, a double parlor in the building 25 Kennard Road, is 1,033 square feet, including the performance area, and seats 60 people.
- A renovated and expanded recital hall will be 1,431 square feet, with the additional 431 square feet doubling audience seating to 120.
- This renovated hall will have a flat floor, allowing for maximum flexibility of use, and the school's standard set-up will move the performance area to the center of the east wall, with audience seating no further than three rows away from the performers.
- The current recital hall is accessible and will remain so. However, navigation of the space for people with different abilities will be dramatically improved with a larger space and different audience/performer orientation in the room.





Project Goals

- Increase frequency and elevate the quality of the students' performance experience.
- Double our audience capacity in a welcoming, flexible space that fosters community.
- Develop approximately 1,465 sq ft of flexible use space to comfortably host larger audiences and ensembles for concerts, recitals and rehearsals.
- Offer a designated performance space for the broader Brookline community to appreciate and enjoy music.
- The enlarged space will also support a better summer program experience for students in Chamber Music Festival, Flute Institute, and JazzLab programs that BMS works closely with Kenny Kozol/PBS to make available to students who otherwise may not have resources to access summer programs.
- The expanded space can be used by Lincoln and other PSB schools to use for rehearsals or performances that would be better served by a hall this size. All PSB use of Kennard House space is free of charge.





Description

- Produce an acoustically appropriate performance space to elevate performances.
- This project increases seating from 60 to 120 and optimizes audience experience.
- The expansion, with upgraded furnishing and lighting, creates a 1,465 sq ft recital hall that
 accommodates a wide range of performances, including student recitals, jazz and rock bands,
 chamber ensembles, and musical theatre, and ensures a high-quality experience for performers and
 audiences alike.
- The total cost of the expansion is \$800,000 and the responsibility of Brookline Music School.
