We have other faculty interested as well depending on our numbers.

- 19. What is the purpose of the trip and how does it relate to Brookline's Learning Expectations (K-8) or BHS Course Syllabi? 1. To meet important heroes of the Civil Rights Movement 2. To see museums and historical sites pertaining to the Civil Rights Movement
- 20. Describe activities planned before the trip to prepare students We will be doing some light curriculum with the students starting in the fall during X blocks to prepare them. As soon as we get approval for this trip, we will begin our recruitment and application process and then jump into the curriculum. Our curriculum will consist of some readings and lessons during X blocks when clubs meet. We will draw directly from our US History units on Civil Rights and focus specifically on the sites we will be visiting. This will not be heavy lifting and will not be a large time commitment outside of school.
- 21. Describe activities planned after the trip for students to wrap-up/reflect: We would like to have the students complete an action project together to confront current racism here at home.

ACCESSIBILITY AND STUDENT SAFETY

We will be meeting with small programs like Malcolm Cawthorne from METCO and Stephanie Hunt from African American Latino Scholars Program as well as other colleagues around the building to help promote and find students who we all think would be interested in this trip. Before Keith Lezama's departure from Brookline, he had stated that METCO had some funds that we could use toward the tuition for interested METCO students, and Malcolm Cawthorne is on board for this as well. The PTO has committed funds for approximately two scholarships.

What measures are planned to ensure student safety on the trip, including chaperone coverage, student behavior contracts, etc. We are hoping that by the nature of the content we will select responsible students who are truly interested in this learning. We will create and sign a behavior contract with the students as well.
