Staff who are new to the Public Schools of Brookline:

Samantha Bracy

Co-Director of Special Education (Baker, Heath, Lincoln, and Runkle)

Samantha Bracy joins the Public Schools of Brookline as the Co-Director of Special Education. Ms. Bracy will work with district and school-level staff to provide leadership, professional development, and support for inclusive education for all students. She will also oversee specialized programming for students with disabilities for Baker, Heath, Lincoln, and Runkle Schools.

Ms. Bracy brings to Brookline over 20 years of experience working in special education. Like so many others, she has roots in Brookline where she first worked as a paraprofessional at Lawrence and in our Extended School Year (ESY) program. From Brookline, Ms. Bracy went on to become a special education teacher in Winthrop and Newton. She comes to us most recently as a special education director at Match Community Day Charter Public School. Over the years, Ms. Bracy developed expertise in students with physical disabilities and students with dyslexia.

In addition to a Master's Degree in Special Education from Northeastern University, Ms. Bracy earned a Certificate of Advanced Graduate Studies in Reading at Bridgewater State University. At Match Community Day, she developed specialized programs and instructional models for students with dyslexia and students with physical disabilities.

Carolyn Wilson

Interim Director of Special Education, Brookline High School

Ms. Carolyn Wilson worked most recently for Nuttall, MacAvoy, and Joyce as an attorney. Prior to that, Ms. Wilson was the Director of Student Services in Reading Public Schools where she oversaw special education, nursing, Section 504, and English Language Learners for the district. Ms. Wilson has worked in special education since 1997, serving in different sectors including a private special education day school, a charter school, and at the state

level with the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. She has also served as a Member-At-Large for the Massachusetts branch of the International Dyslexia Association.

Ms. Wilson received a Bachelor of Arts degree from Saint Anselm College and holds a Master's degree in Special Education from Simmons College. Her Master's thesis focused on the benefits of peer mentoring in a residential setting for adolescent girls with learning disabilities. She also graduated with Honors from Suffolk University where Carolyn earned her law degree.

Michael Chan

Communications Specialist

Mike Chan will be serving as the communications specialist at PSB. Matt DuBois

Assistant Director of Guidance, Clinical Services, and Social-Emotional Learning

Dr. Matt Dubois is the Assistant Director of Guidance, Clinical Services, and Social-Emotional Learning. Dr. Dubois will be working closely with the Office of Student Services, Office of Teaching and Learning, and the school guidance team to create, adapt, and execute SEL initiatives within schools, and provide technical assistance and best practices to district and school staff around promoting students' social-emotional development and well-being. Dr. Dubois will also be responsible for the development and implementation of a comprehensive school counseling program based upon District goals and the identified needs of the students at the PreK-8 level.

Dr. DuBois is a licensed school psychologist and clinical psychologist who has worked at Brookline High School (BHS) since 2016. He earned his doctorate in School Psychology from Northeastern University in May 2015 and subsequently completed a Postdoctoral Fellowship in the Department of Psychiatry and Human Behavior at Brown University.

In his time at BHS, Dr. DuBois served as the lead clinician for the Supported Learning Center (SLC), led the Early Warning Data and Social-Emotional Learning Teams, and was a member of the district-wide Social-Emotional Learning Team. In addition to his role in Brookline, Dr. DuBois has served as a lecturer in Northeastern University's School Psychology program since 2017 and is President-Elect of the Massachusetts School Psychologist's Association (MSPA). Dr. DuBois has published academic and clinical research in the Journal of School Psychology, School Psychology Review, and the Communiqué.

Kendell Jones

Coordinator of Social-Emotional Learning and Mental Health for the Brookline METCO Program K-12

Mr. Kendell Jones is the new Coordinator of Social-Emotional Learning and Mental Health for the Brookline METCO Program K-12. Mr. Jones is a Brookline High School alum and he has worked for the Public Schools of Brookline for 15 years. Prior to this role Mr. Jones served as an advisor for the Steps to Success Program, and as Substance Abuse and Violence Prevention Counselor at BHS for the public health department. Mr. Jones is also the varsity coach for the BHS Lady Warriors basketball team.

In his role as Coordinator, he will facilitate professional learning opportunities for faculty and provide increased communication and resources in the area of SEL and mental health to our METCO scholars and families.

Mr. Jones is also the founder and facilitator of CORE (Communicating Our Real Experiences) a program designed to bring awareness to and address the social, emotional, mental, and health issues that impact the lives of our BIPOC high school students. The goal of **CORE** is to provide student leaders with the platform to make a positive change that will improve students' social and emotional well-being, school culture, and create a more welcoming community for all.

Mr. Jones holds a Bachelor's of Sociology from Florida Memorial University and a Master's in Social Work at Simmons University.

Brendan Kobus

Interim Dean of 9th Grade

Brendan Kobus has taught special education in Brookline since 2009 and has been an Associate Dean for the last five years and principal of our Summer School for the last three. He is an exceptionally competent teacher, dean, and school leader. Mr. Kobus knows the ninth grade faculty, staff, and program well. Greg Porter

Interim Curriculum Coordinator for Social Studies K-8

Greg Porter joins the curriculum department as our Interim Curriculum Coordinator for Social Studies K-8. In this role Mr. Porter will lead the ongoing development of the district's K-8 Social Studies curriculum, supervise middle grades social studies teachers, and serve as a member of the Office of Teaching & Learning's Curriculum Department.

Prior to this role Mr. Porter has served fifteen years in the Public Schools of Brookline including eight years as a 5th grade classroom teacher and seven years as a middle grades social studies teacher at the Lawrence School. He has also been a new teacher mentor and Mentored Professional Learning coach for the district.

Summer Williams has been a Performing Arts teacher at Brookline High School for 17 years and became an Associate Dean three years ago. She was the lead dean for the Class of 2021 and thus managed much of the student support work for this COVID class and the celebrations we had in the spring (commencement, senior block party, etc.). Dean Williams builds and fosters culture, communicates incredibly well, and has been particularly focused on our racial equity efforts through extensive work with professional development and her epic Spring Plays that have elevated student voice. Summer also is the Co-Founder of Company One Theatre in Boston. Ms. Williams holds both graduate and undergraduate degrees from Clark University.

Jamie Yadoff

Interim Principal of Pierce School

Jamie Yadoff will be stepping in as the interim principal of the Pierce School for the 2021-2022 school year. Ms. Yadoff has been Vice Principal at Pierce School since 2018. Prior to that, she was a middle school English, Social Studies and Health teacher at Pierce from 2005 to 2018. Before joining the faculty at Pierce, she was an educator in the Lexington Public Schools for five years.

An established member of the Brookline community, Ms. Yadoff was awarded the Excellence in Education award by the Goldin Foundation in 2011. She also served as chair of the 8th grade Textbook Selection Committee in 2015. Director of Human Resources

Tye'sha Fluker joined the Public Schools of Brookline as the Director of Human Resources in July 2021. In this capacity, Ms. Fluker will provide guidance and support to PSB staff regarding district policies, procedures, and other human resources strategy. Her focus in collaborating and building relationships with educators, municipal officials, and other stakeholders will provide important leadership and create positive outcomes for the Brookline community.

Ms. Fluker most recently served as the Human Capital Manager at the Boston Public Schools, overseeing the district's staffing assignments and reorganizations. Prior to that position, she served as the Human Resources Coordinator at Maranatha High School in Pasadena, CA, where she developed the organization's first Applicant Tracking System. Ms. Fluker played in the Women's National Basketball Association (WNBA) for three seasons, after leading the University of Tennessee to three Final Four appearances and two SEC Titles in her collegiate basketball career.

Ms. Fluker received her Masters of Arts in Human Resources at Ottawa University and a Bachelor of Science in Service Management from the University of Tennessee.

Samuel Rippin

Deputy Superintendent for Administration and Finance

Samuel (Sam) Rippin joins the Public Schools of Brookline as the Deputy Superintendent of Administration and Finance. Mr. Rippin will develop and manage the school budget process, oversee the operating and capital budgets, and work with town departments with respect to facility operations and capital needs in Brookline.

Mr. Rippin last worked as the Assistant Superintendent for Business and Finance at the Dedham Public Schools, a post he has held since 2014. Prior to that he served in similar positions with Winchester, Saugus and Billerica Public Schools. Prior to joining public education, Sam worked in various capacities at Tufts University from 1989 through 2001

in both the Central Administration and its School of Dental Medicine. In addition, has served on boards for various non-profit entities, including the Massachusetts Association of School Business Officials (MASBO) during his career.

Mr. Rippin is a licensed Certified Public Accountant in the States of Massachusetts and Ohio and has been a tax practitioner for over 30 years. He holds a Bachelor of Business Administration from Cleveland State University, a Master of Business Administration from Bentley College and a Certificate of Advanced Educational Studies from Boston College in the area of Education Leadership.

Lesley Ryan Miller

Deputy Superintendent for Teaching and Learning

Lesley Ryan Miller joins the Public Schools of Brookline's Senior Leadership team as the Deputy Superintendent of Teaching and Learning. Ms. Miller brings to this position over 25 years of experience in education as a classroom teacher and as a school and district administrator. Most recently, she served as the Principal of the Pierce School. Prior to taking on the principal position at Pierce, Ms. Miller was Brookline's Senior Director of Teaching and Learning where she oversaw K-8 curriculum in math, literacy, social studies, science and world language.

Before joining the Public Schools of Brookline, Ms. Miller was the Director of Teacher Development and Advancement for the Boston Public Schools where she led new teacher induction, teacher leadership and professional development opportunities for all Boston Public School educators. This followed almost a decade of classroom teaching as a kindergarten and first grade teacher in Boston Public Schools.

Ms. Miller received a Bachelor of Science in Education from Boston University and holds a Master of Education from the Harvard Graduate School of Education. She is a member of Boston University's Black Alumni Leadership Council and the Boston University Alumni Council. She is also a Trustee at The Park School, an independent school in Brookline, and a member of the Girls on the Run Greater Boston Board—a positive youth development program serving girls ages 8-13.

Jenee Uttaro

Senior Director of Educational Equity

Ms. Uttaro accepted the position of Senior Director of Equity in June 2021 and will lead the development of a clear district mission committed to equitable access, process, treatment and outcomes for students; create and oversee ongoing professional learning experiences for staff that address unconscious bias and systematic racism; work with the Office of Teaching and Learning and school administrators to remove barriers for students; and work across PSB central offices to ensure equity is foundational. She will further partner with students, families, and community members in our collective efforts toward continual improvement, and conduct an Equity Audit to identify root causes for equity gaps in the district and plan for ways to address them.

Before coming to Brookline, Ms. Uttaro taught English at Boston Latin School for nine years. She began her tenure with PSB as an English Language Arts teacher at the William H. Lincoln School and transitioned to Brookline High School in 2008. Since then, she has held positions as the Program Administrator for The Literacy Project, Program

Coordinator for the Content-Area Reading Initiative, Interim Executive Director of Steps to Success, Dean of Faculty, and most recently the Dean of the Old Lincoln School.

Ms. Uttaro received her Masters of Education from Boston College and her Masters of Education in Educational Leadership from Endicott College. She is an instructor of graduate students in education leadership and professional learning and is a Council Member of the Massachusetts Department of Elementary and Secondary Education's Racial Imbalance Advisory Council.
