
Financial Update: February 2022

Revenues


- Pandemic began late in the third quarter of 2020 and continues to impact revenue.
- Revenue is growing, but has not yet returned to pre-pandemic levels.
- Enrollment is increasing (2,000 served)
 with return to in-person classes.
- Registration Fees increased (\$8 to \$10).
- Tuition prices increased.
- Pro-Bono Speakers/fundraisers

Projections


Expected Spring Revenue: \$30,000

Instructors: \$20,000


Music Instructors: \$32,014



Best case: Break Even or Possible Small Surplus if Enrollment Sustains and if grant funding is received.


Worst Case: Possible Deficit if Drop in Enrollment

FY21 Revenue: \$281,241

FY22

30% growth was projected. Needed to reach \$518,530. 49% growth achieved to date.

FY23

Goal: 30% growth in revenue. If FY22 Total Revenue is \$595,000, the goal will be to reach \$773,500 in FY23.

FY24

Goal: 30% growth in revenue or \$1,005,550.
