

FY26 Actual & Enrollment Projection

Out of District (OOD): Total reported and claimed for FY26 in Oct. 1 reporting; Excludes students claimed by other communities who cost share tuition with PSB.

PreKindergarten: Classroom closed; negative number does not reflect open seats - all available classes have been filled

Elementary: Kindergarten and 4th grade enrollment were lower than the forecast by more than 30 students

Middle: Overall Middle school enrollment was within 1 of the forecast

High: Though the freshman class was a little higher than the forecast and grade 12 was lower, the overall enrollment forecast for BHS aligned with the Oct. 1 enrollment.




Projection Comparison: Elementary, Middle, High


Elementary enrollment is slightly lower, Middle School enrollment is similar, and BHS enrollment is slightly higher, than predicted by Cropper



Most changes to individual students' enrollment occur during the Summer (June-September).



Each year, student migration accounts for a significant portion of the shift in student enrollment and distribution within schools

- New students (In-Migration) has been less than withdrawals (Out-Migration) for the past 2 years
- There is no overall pattern or trend in Out-Migration
- In Migration has been decline which is reflected in the decline in overall enrollment as reported for SY25-26

Summer Withdrawals (Out-Migration):

Students enrolled in PSB during prior SY who withdraw to attend shool elsewhere for the reported SY


Out migration is largely due to families moving out of Brookline.

This slide provides insight into where students are enrolling after withdrawing from PSB

- Students leaving to attend other schools in MA (green) or in schools outside MA (blue) have moved out of Brookline;
- Only a portion of students leaving to attend MA Private (yellow) remain Brookline residents, as some also move out of Brookline along with the school transfer.

Summer New Student Registrations (In-Migration):


New Students enrolled in PSB to begin attendance for the reported SY

In-Migration is largely due to families moving into Brookline.


This slide provides insight into where students were enrolled prior to joining PSB in the reported year

- Summer In-Migration is down by 22 from last year
- Students enrolling from outside MA declined by 50 this year, proportionally to overall enrollment decline

FY27 Projection Methodology

- 1) Roll each grade level (cohort) forward
- 2) Adjust cohorts based on 3 year average of cohort survival
- 3) Kindergarten is 3 year average

Summary

- Enrollment continues to decline slightly which is consistent with the Cropper & McKibben (C&M) forecast
- Elementary enrollment is slightly lower and BHS enrollment is slightly higher than predicted in the C&M report
- Out migration is higher than in migration but proportionate to enrollment decline
- Graduating cohorts continue to be larger than the incoming kindergarten cohorts
- Overall, FY27 enrollment is expected to be slightly lower
- C&M forecast a slight increase in enrollment starting in FY29
- Enrollment forecasts are vulnerable to changes in housing availability, socio economic environment, and federal policies.
