Budgetary Impact





- The Florida Ruffin Ridley School takes into consideration the budgetary needs of the District and with the funds provided by the Town, State, and federal government. All funding decisions are made with the best interest of children in mind and under the constraints set forth the Town Managers and our School Committee
- Any funds dedicated to the school itself and are at the discretion of the principal go directly towards professional development and stipends for adults who support extra activities such as GSA, school plays/musicals, and athletic coaching positions. FRR's discretionary budget may also support some materials/supports for our Therapeutic Learning Center program.
- Our percentage of high-needs students (English-learners and students with academically-based disabilities) continues to increase.


Our Strategic Objective:



 Continue to provide professional development for teachers that focuses on reading comprehension using the newly adopted Fishtank curriculum. 	September 2025- June, 2026	The percentage of FRR literacy educators who report that they understand and effectively instruct using Fishtank's reading comprehension curriculum increases 20% between November 2026 and June 2026, measured by school survey data.
 Continue to create opportunities for teachers to collaborate in learning communities focused on literacy and math, in order to share strategies, review student work, and discuss progress towards goals. 	Sept. 2025- June, 2026	The percentage of FRR literacy educators who report that they understand and effectively instruct using Fishtank increases 20% between November 2026 and June 2026, measured by school survey data. EOY STAR Math SGP data in grades 3-8 meets or exceeds BOY STAR Math SGP data.
Pilot the use of UFLI in some classrooms and intervention spaces to augment students' decoding skills as part of our MTSS system.	September 2025- June, 2026	The percentage of FRR students requiring intervention (as defined by STAR scores) decreases by 20% between the fall and spring windows of STAR.
