## EDUCATIONAL RELEVANCE

- 18. What is the purpose of the trip and how does it relate to Brookline's Learning Expectations (K-8) or BHS Course Syllabi? Students will participate in a Model United Nations conference moderated by college students and professionals. They will learn to work with other students to resolve international issues confronting the world today. In the process they will learn about current events, world history and geography.
- 19. Describe activities planned before the trip to prepare students: Students begin to prepare for the conference one month in advance by writing research papers on our assigned country.
- 20. Describe activities planned after the trip for students to wrap-up/reflect: Students will debrief their experiences and share solutions found for various international issues.

- 21. To what extent does the field trip group reflect the diversity of the school population? What efforts will be undertaken to ensure that, to the greatest extent possible, the participants in this field trip reflect the diversity of the school population? We actively strive to ensure that our club reflects the diversity of the school. In addition to participating in the annual Club Day (see #13), we also have a vibrant Middle School UN Club that is helping us to reach an even larger audience of students. In addition, Mr. G-J and other faculty have actively recruited students from programs such as African-American and Latino Scholars, METCO, Opportunity for Change and SWS.

What measures are planned to ensure student safety on the trip, including chaperone coverage, student behavior contracts, etc. This conference is planned and organized by a professional non-profit organization known as MUNDO (Model United Nations Development Organization). Based in Chicago, the conference staff are members of the organizations and students from over 25 universities around the US. The conference is hosted in the Sante Fe district of Mexico City, and contained entirely within the Hilton Double Tree Hotel. Two BHS faculty members will be chaperoning, as they have done in the past for similar trips, both national and international.
