Pierce Project Update: Thank you MSBA

- The MSBA voted to increase the building construction reimbursement cap for the Pierce School from \$393/sf to \$516/sf and the site construction reimbursement cap from \$39/sf to \$52/sf.
 - Our OPM believes that this will represent a change from a maximum reimbursement of \$37,839,511 to \$45,403,459. This has the potential to shift the Town share from \$172MM down to \$164.5MM, resulting in a savings of \$7.6MM. Final numbers will be finalized by MSBA in the coming month.

The Brookline High School Drama Society held multiple shows of their 9th grade play, *The Rehearsal*, at the 22 Tappan theater last week.


The Rehearsal is a play about a high school putting on a musical — a hilarious look behind the scenes of a drama club production filled with lots of drama.



We warmly welcome Monique to the PSB community.




Staffing Update: Harvard Intern

OCTOBER 24 Dussehra

OCTOBER 31 Halloween
