


Kindergarten Registration for SY 2025-26

The online registration for students entering kindergarten for the 2025-26 school year opens on **January 8, 2025**.



Discovering Justice Mock Trials

Dr. Jodi Fortuna, our Deputy Superintendent of Teaching and Learning, was summoned for jury duty at the Discovering Justice Mock Trial event earlier this month.



Discovering Justice is a civic education non-profit that works with students to introduce them to the workings of the legal system, and help them explore the ideals of justice. Discovering Justice is an afterschool partner of the Hayes, Runkle, and Florida Ruffin Ridley Communities.

Hayes and Runkle held their trials at the Moakley Courthouse, and Florida Ruffin Ridley had their mock trial at the Brookline District Court.

This year's case concerns students' First Amendment rights and peaceful assembly. The student attorneys did an outstanding job pleading their cases.

Parent Workshop – *Navigating the Cyber World*



The Office of Student Services has organized a parent workshop, *Navigating the Cyber World*, on January 15th from 7pm to 8pm.

The workshop reviews the challenges and dangerous situations that may arise through use of the internet, social media, and smartphones. It is important for school staff and parents to be aware of the popular apps, social media sites, and programs used by youth online. This workshop explains the issues and possible consequences of cyberbullying, sexting, and revealing identifying information to strangers.
