


National School Lunch Week

Introducing Kelp at PSB

The PSB partnered with North Coast Seafoods to introduce kelp in our meals at Brookline High School during National School Lunch Week. Grown and hand-harvested by fishing families in New England, kelp is one of the most nutrient-dense foods on the planet. It's packed with minerals, vitamins and antioxidants, supporting heart, gut, thyroid health and more.

Additionally, kelp is a carbon-neutral, sustainable, zero-input crop. Kelp farms are regenerative, improving ocean health by removing excess carbon, and locally mitigating the effects of ocean acidification in the Gulf of Maine.

Brookline High School has created a new service opportunity for students, as well as community members, caregivers and parents, with the new BHS indoor farm.



The 20th Annual BHS College Essay Workshop

On September 30, over 170 students participated in the 20th Annual BHS College Essay Workshop, a partnership between the Brookline High School PTO and the Brookline English Dept. Students worked with teachers from across the school and parent/community volunteers, as well as with each other, to start, refine or finalize their college essays.

This exciting project has helped over 3,000 students navigate an important part of the college application process.

Last week, twenty intrepid BHS adventurers took to the Charles River on kayaks and paddleboards on a perfect fall afternoon.




The LGBTQ Task Force

Unified Sports at Brookline High School






Unified Sports in 2023-24




Staffing Update

Held a community circle with principals to discuss impact at individual building levels

Collaborated with principals, OEE and Curriculum Coordinators to evaluate new resources and messaging regarding those resources

Retracted original biased curriculum materials and replaced with resources focused on student support
