**English Learner Education Registration Data**

Following my report to you last week about student registration and enrollment, I am pleased to be able to share the additional information you requested regarding English Learner (EL) student registration.

Mindy Paulo, ELE Coordinator, and Caitlin O'Neil, our new ELE Enrollment and Assessment Specialist, report:

- Of the 376 students who took an English proficiency screening between July 1 and September 7, 270 students (or 72%) qualified for ELE services.

- Of the 270 students who qualified for ELE services, this is the breakdown of their levels:

1.0-1.9	145 students (54%)
2.0-2.9	38 students (14%)
3.0-3.9	55 students (20%)
4.0-4.9	31 students (12%)
5.0-5.9	1 student

- Level 1 is for students who are at the beginning stages of acquiring English; students at Level 6 are considered fluent in English.

Below are two tables for further clarification.

Total number of students who took an English proficiency screening between July 1<sup>st</sup> and September 7<sup>th</sup>, this year and last year:

\*This represents an 8% increase year to year.
