# Monday is Juneteenth



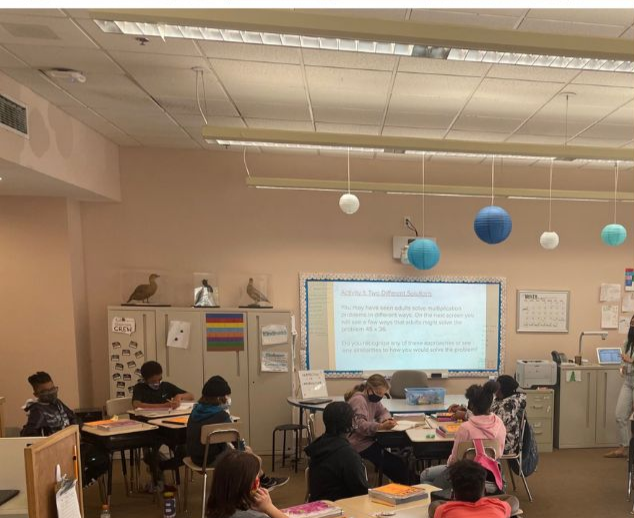
