Brookline High School's student-run newspaper, formerly "The Sagamore," announced on **Wednesday, January 18** that they will change its name out of respect for Indigenous people who use the word.

"The Sagamore," references the Indigenous term "Sagamore," which denotes a leader of some New England Indigenous tribes, including the Massachusetts Tribe at Ponkapoag. **Newspaper staff concluded that usage of the name perpetuates a history of misrepresentation and appropriation of Indigenous peoples and serves as a reminder of the erasure of their cultures.**
