COLD WEATHER & ICE SAFETY TIPS





DRESS IN SEVERAL LAYERS

Wear loose-fitting, lightweight clothing instead of a single heavy layer. Outer garments should be tightly woven and water repellent.



BE VIGILANT

Do not ignore shivering—it's an important first sign that your body is losing heat. Constant shivering is a sign that it is time to go inside.



PET SAFETY REMINDERS

Take precautions during cold—pet should not be left outside for long periods of time during below-freezing weather. Check dogs' paws for signs of cold-weather injury like cracking or bleeding.

Call for BEF Caverly and Sperber Awards




