License Agreement with Brookline Teen Center for Pierce School

As the enrollments have continued to grow at the Pierce School, it has become clear that the existing building can no longer serve the number of classes required for Physical Education and Health classes. In the spring of 2017, the decision was made not to pursue additional square footage at 62 Harvard Street. A new approach was considered to provide this needed space. Tina Bozeman, Health and Fitness Coordinator, Chris Kelley, former Pierce School Principal and Lesley Ryan-Miller, Interim Principal of the Pierce School, have spoken with Matthew Cooney, Executive Director of the Teen Center about space availability at the Center during the school day. This collaborative agreement would provide additional space and allow the scheduling of physical education/health classes appropriately across the grades.

The funding for the license, \$50,000, will come, in part, from Classroom Capacity which ended FY17 with \$45,000 encumbered for this space. A review of lease payments and increases due to CPI will determine if there are additional funds available for this lease. If not, an additional funding request will come to the School Committee in October as part of the 1st Quarter Financial Report.

Attached is the final agreement for the 2017-2018 school year, the spaces being utilized at the Teen Center, and the parent communication from the Principal.

School Committee Action:

Authorize Town Counsel to enter into a license with the Brookline Teen Center with the attached terms and conditions set forth in the RFP response.







FACILITY OVERVIEW


The Brookline Teen Center is an architecturally award winning 12,000 square foot renovated 1930's era garage.




FITNESS CENTER

Bowling and Yoga Studio




CANDLEPIN BOWLING

The BTC also offers members Chromebooks which they can check out and use within the center. Academic support, homework help and 1:1 tutoring are also available at the BTC.

The conference room has 7 tables (6'x3') that can be arranged in a boardroom-style or classroom-style and can seat 35 people. The room has a projector and a dry erase wall and is perfect fit for group meetings and projects.

Teen Center Student Procedures & Expectations

- All Pierce School rules and policies apply to health and physical education classes that take place at the Teen Center.
- Students must report directly to the Teen Center on mornings that they have health or physical education class.
- Students may not enter the building prior to 7:50 AM.
- If a student is arriving late, they will still report immediately to the Teen Center. The health/physical education teacher will contact the front office directly in order to let them know that the student has arrived.
- If a student is dismissed early, while at the Teen Center, the parent/guardian shall sign the student out in the main office at Pierce School. The secretary will communicate the dismissal information to the health and physical education teacher. The parent/guardian will pick the student up at the Teen Center.
- Students should be prepared for inclement weather, as the Teen Center will be accessed on inclement weather days.
- Students must treat each area and all equipment at the Teen Center with respect. It is a privilege to be using this facility.
- Following the two classes held at the Teen Center, students will be escorted by the health and physical education teachers back to the main Pierce School campus where they can go to their lockers and/or report to their next period class.
- Students at Pierce participating in early morning support/classroom events will meet in the cafeteria at 7:50 a.m. and be escorted to the Teen Center by Pierce staff.
