Draw a picture (with caption) of this space.</p>	<p>FREE VERSE POETRY: Write a poem that does not require regular rhythm or a rhyme scheme.</p>	<p>PROVERB: Choose a proverb (popularly known and repeated saying based on a common-sense truth). Rewrite it to make a truth about your own life.</p>	<p>FREE CHOICE! Write openly and freely about whatever you want.</p>
<p>DIALOGUE: Write dialogue (words spoken between characters) to show a character's personality.</p>	<p>REVIEW: Write a review of a book, short story, or magazine article.</p>	<p>LIMERICK: Write a limerick (a silly, five-line poem with a specific rhyming pattern).</p>	<p>OPINION STATEMENT: Write a statement that expresses your opinion about a subject. Include 2-3 supporting details.</p>	<p>VOCABULARY: Define a vocabulary word with a situational example (a short scene that shows the meaning of the word).</p>
<p>JOURNAL: Record what happened today with personal reflection on emotions and relationships with family and friends.</p>	<p>CYCLE DIAGRAM: Draw a diagram that shows the steps of a cycle of events in a visual way. Don't forget to label!</p>	<p>FREE CHOICE! Write openly and freely about whatever you want.</p>	<p>OBSERVATION REPORT: Write an observation of something you did this week. Include vivid details that appeal to the senses.</p>	<p>CONCRETE POEM: Write a poem about a household item that takes the shape of that item. (Ex: a poem about a TV in the shape of a TV)</p>
<p>FRIENDLY LETTER: Write an informal letter to a relative or a friend.</p>	<p>FABLE: Write a modern day fable--fictitious story meant to teach a moral; characters are usually animals.</p>	<p>RESPONSE: Write a personal response to a famous quote.</p>	<p>PERSUASIVE WRITING: Pick a topic you are passionate about and write a speech to convince others.</p>	<p>DESCRIPTIVE ESSAY: Write a factual piece of writing. Give a clear, detailed picture of a person, place, thing, or event.</p>
